3. Chair's Comments. *Stavros Constantinou*
  - Stavros begins with EGSG fiscal health
  - Things were quite dire after funds paid out for last year's awards
  - Club 50 support (voluntary donations) has been essential to maintaining health of accounts
  - Club 50 Volunteers thanked for writing generous checks to EGSG
  - Stavros mentions possibility of raising dues noting that other groups have dues in

- the ranges of \$15, \$12, etc
- EGSG is currently at \$6
- Raises questions about whether we should increase our dues. This would remove need for volunteer donations
- This would also allow us to support awards and support REP and have safety baseline
- Lawrence notes that since 1992 we have rarely raised dues
- Motion from Lawrence to raise professional dues to \$10 and leave the student dues to \$3
- Discussion: Query about what average is; whether \$10 is acceptable; should we increase student dues above \$4
- Question called
- Unanimous approval. EGSG dues will be \$10 per year for non student members and \$3 for student members

- AAG membership close to 11,000
- Query from the floor about membership breakdown by ethnicity
- Joy Adams comments that there is some information about this in April newsletter and that AAG is seeking information about ethnicity and other demographics from departments for both faculty and students.

- Announced that University of Puerto Rico, San Juan to host for 2012
- John introduced 2 co-directors, Angel David Cruz and Carlos Guilbe, both Professors of Geography at the University of Puerto Rico, San Juan. John remains the Director.
- They are very pleased to be hosting conference, encourage the bringing of families
- Conference will be held about a month before the elections
- John has already travelled to PR, great site, university provided enthusiastic response
- National committee will work with local hosts to plan
- Aiming for website information available on May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2011
- Aiming for an even larger group than in past REP conference
- Intercontinental hotel \$139 per night, beachfront
